


Chord diagrams






Tablature

In this book, the tablature or tab system will be used in the strings all notes played examples and with a strum 1E _ 2B lessons. The _ 3G diagram is a 4D 5A guide to reading 6E the tablature. third fret first fret open first second string string string

The horizontal line represents the strings. The numbers on the lines indicates the frets played.

We now take a break from strumming and try a bit of plucking or fingerpicking. You can use your fingers or a pick. These patterns are used for playing ballads and slow songs.

```
p = bass string (depends on chords played)
thumb / pick
i = 3rd string - 1st finger / pick
m = 2nd string - 2nd finger / pick
a = 1st string - 3rd finger / pick
```

The chart shows the bass notes (p) for each chord.
